## MASCOT & COLOR

**“CRUSADERS”** - The name “Crusader” was first associated with Holy Cross in 1884 at an alumni banquet in Boston, where an engraved Crusader mounted on an armored horse appeared at the head of the menu. The name was rediscovered by Stanley Woodward, a sports reporter for the Boston Herald, when he used the term “Crusader” to describe the Holy Cross baseball team in a story written in 1925. The name appealed to the Holy Cross student body, which held a vote later in that year to decide whether this cognomen or one of the other two currently in use - “Chiefs” and “Sagamores” - would be adopted. The Tomahawk of Oct. 6, 1925, reported that the results of the ballot were: Crusaders 143, Chiefs 17, Sagamores 7.

**PURPLE** - The official color for the College of the Holy Cross is purple, which comes from the motto “In Hoc Signo Vinces” on the purple labarum (military standard) of King Constantine the Great (born about 275 A.D., died in 337 A.D.)

## Elvis Comrie 16th Season

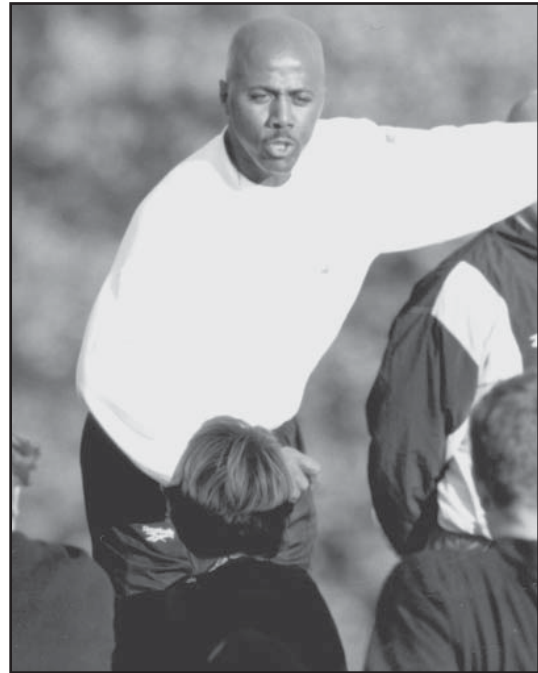
Elvis Comrie is in his 16th season as the head coach of the Crusaders. He has the most career wins (103) of any men's soccer coach in school history and is the most tenured coach in the history of Holy Cross soccer.

Comrie has guided the Crusaders to nine Patriot League Tournaments in the past 12 seasons, including a string of seven straight appearances from 1997-2003.

In 2002, he led Holy Cross to a 13-5-1 overall record and the Patriot League Regular Season and Tournament Championships for the first time in school history. The 13 wins marked the most victories in the 38-year history of the men's soccer program at Holy Cross. That season, Comrie led the Crusaders to their first NCAA Tournament appearance, where they lost to Fairleigh Dickinson on penalty kicks. The Crusaders finished third in the NSCAA/adidas Division I poll for the New England region, after earning the school's first national Top 25 ranking on October 14, 2002. Holy Cross also won its second consecutive Patriot League Regular Season Championship in 2002, after winning the regular season title in 2001 with a 10-5-2 (6-0-1 Patriot League) record.

In 1995, Comrie guided Holy Cross to one of the most successful seasons in school history. The Crusaders became just the second team in Patriot League history to go undefeated in conference play (5-0-1). After opening the season with a 1-0 loss to eventual NCAA Champion Wisconsin, the Crusaders reeled off eight straight wins to climb to the top of the league standings. For his efforts Comrie was named the 1995 Patriot League Coach of the Year by his peers, an award he also received in 1999 and 2001 after Holy Cross finished first in the PL in the regular season with unbeaten records (5-0-1 in 1999 and 6-0-1 in 2001). In 2001, Holy Cross hosted the Patriot League Men's Soccer Championship Tournament for the third time.

Comrie took over the Crusader program in 1991, and in just three years turned the program into a New England contender. His 1993 squad, featuring five sophomores and five freshmen in the starting lineup, won nine games and earned Holy Cross a Top-10 New England ranking for the first time since 1985. Holy Cross improved to 10 wins the



following year, finishing seventh in the final New England poll.

Comrie came to Mount St. James with an extensive background as a player, coach and administrator. As an assistant coach under Shaun Green at Central Connecticut from 1989-90, he helped the Blue Devils to a 25-13-1 record. In 1989, Central Connecticut went 15-3 and earned a top five ranking in New England.

As a collegiate player, Comrie was a four-year starter for the University of Connecticut, leading the Huskies to the NCAA National Championship in 1981. Over the course of his career, he received All-America, All-New England and All-Yankee Conference honors, as well as being named Collegiate Player of the Year in 1981 by Soccer America. He is currently the second all-time leading scorer at UConn with 145 career points.

Comrie also was successful on the professional and international circuits. In 1982 he was the runner up for NASL Rookie of the Year as a member of the Montreal Manic in the first of his nine professional seasons. He earned NASL All-Star honors in 1984 when he helped lead the Chicago Sting to the NASL Championship. He played internationally in France, as well as playing for the United States National Team.

Comrie was inducted into the Connecticut Hall of Fame in 2005.



With 13 letterwinners and five starters returning from last year, including five of the top six scorers on the team, the 2006 Holy Cross Crusaders have a solid core of veteran players who are hoping to take the program to new heights in Patriot League play.

"We have a very focused, excited group coming back," said head coach **Elvis Comrie**. "They have worked hard to create definitive goals for themselves and have really come together as a team. They established a foundation during the Spring that everyone is excited about and looking forward to this upcoming season."

In 2005, nine different players recorded goals, seven different players recorded assists, and all but three of those point-getters are returning this season.

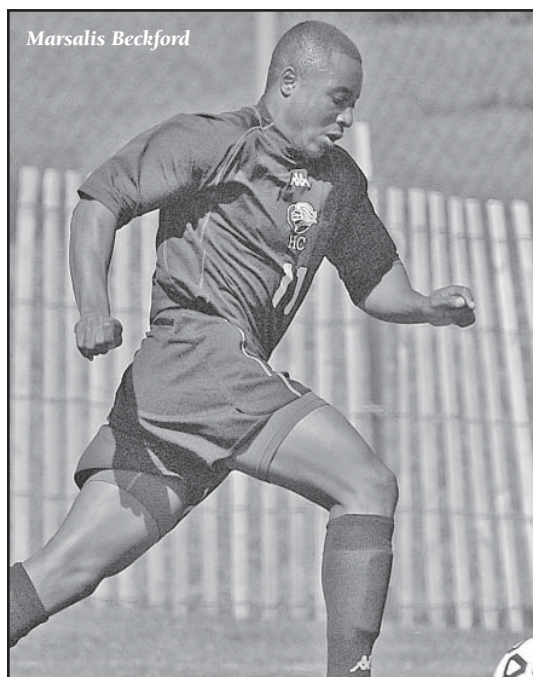
"The return of our two top goal scorers in **Josh Trott** and **Marsalis Beckford**, and the emergence of **Sefton Kincaid** will play key roles in our overall success this coming year," said Comrie. "I think the sophomore class (**Andreas Andrews**, **Keith Bauer**, **Felipe Castrillon**, **Joseph Cherackel**, **Jerry Dickinson**, **Kregory Hefner**, **Alejandro Melean**, **Peter Siclari**) has made tremendous strides in establishing themselves and I expect them to make a difference this year. And **Alex Cruz**, **Yannick James**, and **Andrew Thompson** will give us valuable upperclassmen leadership."

With excellent team dynamics and 10 newcomers expected to offer immediate depth to an already talented squad, look for Holy Cross to make a run for the 2006 Patriot League championship.

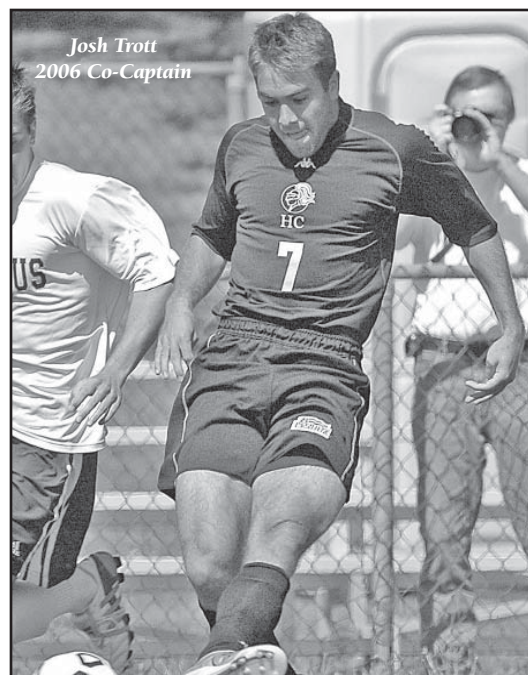
### FORWARDS

The 2006 Crusaders will be led by two-time All-Region and three-time All-Patriot League selection, **Josh Trott**. Trott returns as the team's top goal scorer and point-getter, as he finished the 2005 campaign tied for first in the Patriot League in total points, points per game, goals and goals per game. The New York native enters the 2006 season ranked 10th on the program's all-time list for career points (41 career points) and is six goals away from breaking into the program's Top 5 for career goals.

Alongside Trott at the striker position will be junior **Marsalis Beckford**, who emerged as one of the top forwards in the Patriot League in 2005. Beckford earned a starting job last season and showed signs of dominance during conference play, finishing the

season as the top point-getter and one of the top goal scorers in the league.

Juniors **Sefton Kincaid** and **Chidie Okpoebo** will also be back in the line-up this season. Kincaid will look to bounce back from a tough sophomore year after his breakout freshman campaign, in which he finished the season second on the team in scoring, while Okpoebo, who has started 27 of 30 career games, will bring a wealth of game experience and consistency up front.

Talented sophomore **Felipe Castrillon** was a two-time BRINE Rookie of the Week selection last season and finished the season in the Patriot League Top 15 in both goals and goals per game. Castrillon's speed and stellar ball-handling skills overshadow what he lacks in size, as he is expected to be one of the team's top goal scorers in 2006.

Senior **Yannick James** is back in uniform this season after sitting out last year. James will be returning after a solid 2004 season in which he started nine out of the 12 games he played in, while recording two goals, including a game-winner.

Freshman **Wesley Laine** will look to contribute right away on the Crusader front line.

### MIDFIELDERS

Sophomore **Andreas Andrews** returns as the team's top playmaker, having totaled seven assists last season, finishing just three assists short of program record-holder Dean Casagrande '83. A BRINE Rookie of the Week selection, Andrews finished the season ranked second in the Patriot League in assists and was one of only four players on the team to start all 16 games a year ago. The California native possesses experience beyond his youth, playing consistently with composure and grace in the midfield.

Fellow sophomore **Alejandro Melean** showed signs of a smart, level-headed player last season and is expected to fight for more playing time in 2006. Melean appeared in 13 games last season and recorded a goal.

Freshmen **Franco Bacigalupo** and **Ryan O'Hanlon** will also vie for playing time in the midfield.

**DEFENDERS**

A majority of the Class of 2006 made up the core of the Holy Cross defense, and it will be difficult to replace two-time All-Patriot League selection **Kevin Leonard**, as well as three-year starters **Gamal Baker** and **William Walker**, but the 2006 roster is full of young, talented players who are looking forward to the challenge.

Sophomore and 2006 co-captain, **Jerry Dickinson**, will be looked upon to anchor the defense this season, as one of only four players on the team to start all 16 games last year. At six-foot-one, Dickinson is an imposing presence in the backfield, but also has the speed and talent to make things happen offensively.

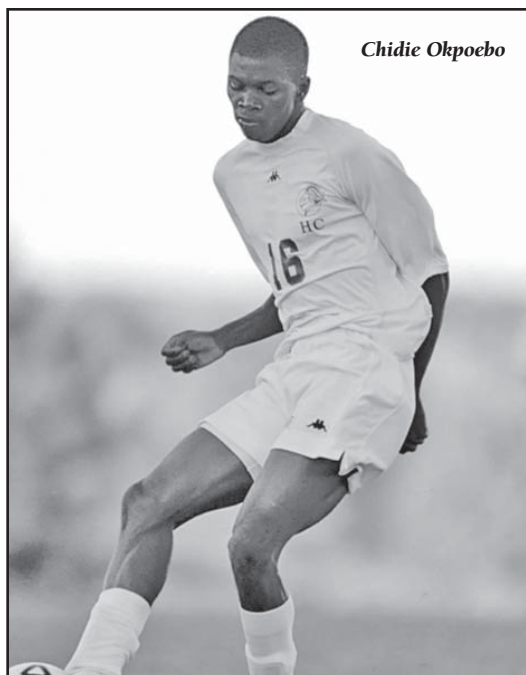
Seniors **Andrew Thompson** and **Alex Cruz** bring veteran experience to the club, combining for 58 career games and 21 career starts between them. Thompson is perhaps one of the most reliable backs on the squad, while Cruz will be back in the line-up after sitting out in 2005.

Versatile sophomores **Kregory Hefner**, **Joseph Cherackel** and **Peter Siclari**, along with newcomers **Ben Salmon**, **Luke Van Patten** and **Peter Whooley** will add depth and give the team options in both the midfield and backfield.

**GOALKEEPERS**

The Crusaders have three very capable, yet very young goalkeepers who will be fighting for starting job in 2006. The veteran of the group is sophomore **Keith Bauer**. Bauer saw limited playing time in 2005, after spending the season backing-up the since-graduated **Richard Whipple**. In the time that he saw, however, Bauer recorded a win in his only start, turning away six shots against Harvard in the Crusaders' 2-1 win.

Comrie is also expecting big things from freshmen keepers **Tom Booth** and **David LeBar**. Booth is a five-foot-11 native of New York who was an All-County selection last season. He also spent time on the 2005 Super Y-League National ODP Team and the 2005 Long




Island Rough Riders Super Y-League North American team.

LeBar, who posted 10 shutouts and a 0.97 goals against average his senior season, has a solid six-foot-two, 190-pound frame. The Florida product earned Second Team All-Central Florida and All-Conference accolades after leading Winter Springs to the 2005 District championship.

## LINDA JOHNSON SMITH STADIUM

The Holy Cross men's and women's soccer programs have much to be excited about in 2006. Not only will this year mark the beginning of a new season and feature new teams full of talent and promise, but it also marks the school's inaugural season playing in a new stadium atop Mount St. James.

The blueprints of the new field were created on the premise of supporting nationally recognized Division I soccer programs and continuing the success of both the men's and women's teams at Holy Cross.

"Building a new stadium is a reflection of the school's commitment to the students and student-athletes," said men's head coach Elvis Comrie. "It gives us a place to be proud of and call our own, and it reflects positively on us as a program, as it now puts us on par with everyone else at the Division I level.

It will certainly assist us in our efforts with recruiting, playing great soccer and giving our fans a nice place to sit and watch a game."

Construction began in the Spring of 2005 and a few months later, on May 19, 2005, the Linda Johnson Smith Stadium was introduced at a small groundbreaking ceremony behind the Hart Center. Linda Johnson Smith is wife and business partner of Park B. Smith (Class of 1954), and both were leading contributors to the major fundraising campaign for construction of the stadium.

In addition to the Smiths, major contributors in attendance at the groundbreaking were: Michael Greene (Class of 1984); Sean (Class of 1976) and Cathy (Class of 1977) O'Neil; Tim Egan (Class of 1977); and Chris (Class of 1980) and Cathy (Class of 1980) Collins.

Located behind the Hart Center, the state-of-the-art soccer stadium features a top-quality grass field and permanently installed aluminum stands, which seat approximately 1,250 spectators. The facility is surrounded by a fence, with an attractive entrance where tickets will be sold and collected. It also includes a press box at the top of the bleachers, with space for the public address announcer, media and a VIP section. In addition, the stadium has sufficient lighting for night games, as well as a large scoreboard.

The cost of the facility was in excess of \$2 million. The money was raised through a fundraising campaign, as part of the Lift High the Cross Campaign, which seeks to enhance Holy Cross' place among the nation's premier liberal arts colleges.

The stadium is the first new playing facility on campus since the debut of the lighted artificial turf field and running track in 1988. It will primarily be used by the varsity programs, but may also be used to host regional events.

## SMITH WELLNESS CENTER

Opened in 1997, the Carol and Park B. Smith Wellness Center is a two-story facility which was built as an addition to the Hart Recreation Center. The Wellness Center provides state-of-the-art fitness equipment for varsity athletes and all other members of the Holy Cross community.

A \$1.5 million gift from Carol and Park B. Smith '54 kicked off the campaign to fund the facility. "Everyone today agrees that fitness is very important," Smith said. "I'm confident that this Wellness center - whose facilities will be second-to-none - will provide a real benefit to current and future Holy Cross students, teachers and staff."

With 15,000 square feet, the Wellness Center provides over four times more space than the College previously had for varsity and community exercise and training, and centralizes athletic equipment and facilities once found in five locations in three campus buildings.

On the first level, the center houses a highly versatile strength and conditioning center for Holy Cross' 650 student-athletes. There are areas for speed development programs, as well as for strength and endurance conditioning. The space, which is able to accommodate as many as 60 people at a time, enables Holy Cross' larger sports teams to work out together, thereby enhancing team unity.

The second floor has been designed for use by all students, faculty and staff. It has two sections: one for aerobic training, and the other for cardiovascular, variable-resistance and strength training. A diverse selection of equipment accommodates users ranging from beginners to advanced athletes. Its south facing wall is mostly glass, allowing most users a view of the practice fields and the rolling hills of central New England.

The center also offers programs that explore the connections between fitness and wellness, and help students learn how good health can compliment and enhance other aspects of their educational experience.

An advisory board comprising physicians, fitness and strength trainers, faculty members, psychologists, nutritionists, a College chaplain, and others are responsible for creating and coordinating programming for the Center.

With 6,500 square feet of the Center devoted solely to varsity athletes, a much greater number of athletes can be accommodated at one time, and teams can train together at times more convenient to their busy schedules as student-athletes.

The state-of-the-art equipment in the Wellness Center includes eight multi-purpose power racks, each with over 600 pounds of free weights; seven Olympic lifting platforms with over 375 pounds of rubberized free weights, more than 3000 pounds of dumbbells, 18 pieces of aerobic equipment, three full sets of plyometric boxes and a number of free weight-loaded pieces of equipment to accommodate injured athletes.



Holy Cross is renowned for its academic excellence and mentoring-based, liberal arts education in the Jesuit tradition. An exclusively undergraduate institution with just over 2,700 students, Holy Cross is the oldest Catholic college in New England. Founded in 1843 in Worcester, Mass., the campus occupies 174 beautifully landscaped acres, featuring traditional and contemporary architecture, state-of-the-art facilities, and striking views from atop Mount St. James.

Academic life at Holy Cross is serious, challenging and exciting. Student-professor exchanges in the classroom, as well as in countless informal settings, are at the center of academic life at Holy Cross. With a student to faculty ratio of 11 to one, the opportunity for individual attention is readily available. Few classes exceed an enrollment of 40, and most average 19 students.

Holy Cross professors are widely respected in their academic specialties. Many have national reputations for their research and publications, creative performances, recordings and exhibitions. Almost all of the nearly 300 full- and part-time faculty members hold doctoral degrees from some of the finest universities here and abroad.

Among the major academic facilities on campus are Dinand Library (which, along with three other specialized libraries on campus, has total holdings of more than 650,000 volumes); Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Art Gallery (with a regular schedule of world-class exhibitions); Brooks Concert Hall (acclaimed by performers and acoustical experts as one of the finest medium-sized performance spaces in the region); St. Joseph Memorial Chapel (built in 1924 and containing the recently renovated McCooey Chapel on the lower level); Hogan Campus Center (with bookstore, post office, coffee lounge, cafeteria and pub); Carol and Park B. Smith Hall (housing the Center for Religion, Ethics and Culture and the Rehm Library); the Multimedia Resource Center in Edith Stein Hall; and the science complex in Haberin, O'Neil and Swords Halls.

Coeducational since 1972, Holy Cross enrolls a student body of proven accomplishment. Almost all graduated in the top 20 percent of their high school classes. Most live in 10 residence halls on campus, all fully connected to the college's computer network. Students, elected by their peers, represent their classmates at faculty meetings, on major college committees, and in a consultative capacity on the appointment and promotion of faculty. There are more than 100 co-curricular offerings on campus and diverse opportunities for innovative academic options such as the first-year program, community-based learning, Washington semester, internships and full-year study abroad.



Holy Cross integrates faith and knowledge with an emphasis on service, in keeping with the Jesuits' commitment to educate "men and women for others." A distinguishing and all-important characteristic of education at Holy Cross is the emphasis placed upon the service of faith and the promotion of justice. The Office of the College Chaplains advises Student Programs for Urban Development (SPUD), which is the largest student organization on campus. More than 450 students are involved in 37 direct-service programs in Worcester.

## **CORRESPONDENCE**

It is important for prospective student-athletes to get in touch with head coach Elvis Comrie as soon as possible. A simple letter of inquiry into the men's soccer program will initiate the recruiting process. The spring of your junior year or early senior year is the most appropriate time to contact coach.

## **INTERVIEWS**

Students are strongly encouraged to have admissions interviews. The office offers interviews from the summer **until January 15**. Alumni interviews in most metropolitan areas are available. Students must first submit an application and indicate they would like an alumni interview before **December 15**.

## **EARLY DECISION**

Students who are absolutely, 100% confident Holy Cross is their top college choice are encouraged to apply during the Early Decision process.

## **FINANCIAL AID**

All financial aid is awarded on the basis of need. Prospective student-athletes should complete the CSS "Profile Form" in early Fall.

## **CLEARINGHOUSE**

The NCAA mandates that all student-athletes interested in competing at the Division I or II level must be certified through the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse. Contact high school coaches, athletics director or guidance counselor for necessary registration forms.

## **TELEPHONE CALLS**

As per NCAA by law 13.1.3.1, institutional staff members may not telephone a prospect (or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians) prior to July 1 following the prospect's completion of the junior year in high school. After July 1, institutional staff members may telephone a prospect once per week (measured Sunday through Saturday). The once-per-week limit applies to the entire institution.

**\*\* Spring/Summer of 2006 --** make unofficial visits to schools of interest and contact Head Coach Elvis Comrie if Holy Cross falls within your top-five list of potential colleges.

**\*\* Summer of 2006 --** Head Coach Elvis Comrie will be in contact regarding student-athlete's interest and possible visit date.

**\*\* December 15 --** Deadline for Admissions Early Decision.

**\*\* January 15 --** Deadline for Admissions Regular Decision.

### **APPLICATION DEADLINES:**

**December 15** - Early Decision

**December 15** - Last day to request alumni interview (application needs to be postmarked by this date)

**January 15** - Regular Decision

**January 15** - last day for on-campus interviews

## **VIDEO TAPES**

In an attempt to make an accurate assessment as soon as possible, it is recommended that videotapes be forwarded to head coach Elvis Comrie's attention as soon as possible. The video need not be an elaborate production. Some simple game or practice tape is sufficient with you being easily identified.

## **CONTACTS**

As per NCAA by law 13.02.3, a contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's parent or legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of a greeting. Any such face-to-face encounter that is prearranged or takes place on the grounds of the prospect's high school, or at the site of organized competition or practice involving the prospect's high school, preparatory school, two-year college, or all-star team is considered a contact, regardless of the conversation that occurs. We are limited to three off-campus contacts per prospective student-athlete.

## **EVALUATIONS**

As per NCAA by law 13.02.6.1, an evaluation is any off-campus activity designed to assess the academic qualifications or athletic ability of a prospect, including any visit to a prospect's educational institution (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of a prospect participating in any practice or competition at any size. We are limited in our number of evaluations per prospective student-athlete.

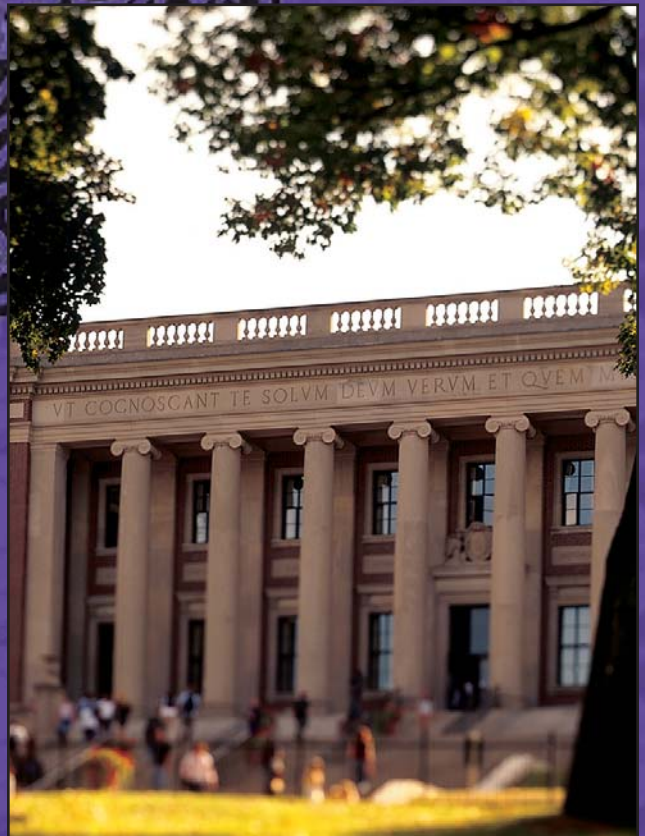
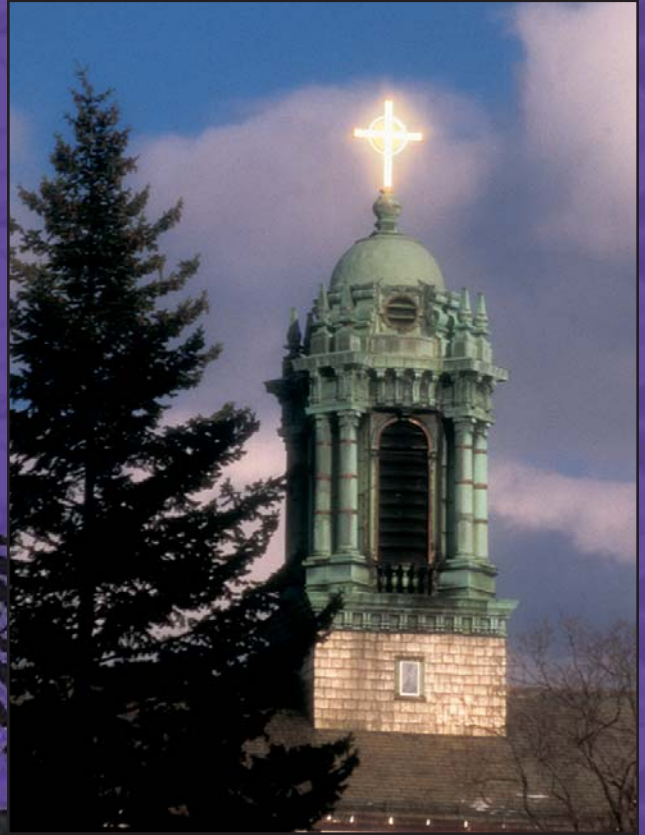
## **OFFICIAL VISITS**

According to NCAA by law 13.7.1.2, a prospect may not make more than five expense-paid visits to NCAA member institutions, regardless of the number of sports in which the prospect is involved. An institution may not provide an expense-paid visit to a prospect who has not presented the institution with a high school (or college) academic transcript and a score from a PSAT, an SAT, a PACTPlus, or an ACT test taken on a national testing date under national testing conditions.

## **UNOFFICIAL VISITS**

According to NCAA by law 13.8.1, a prospect may visit an institution's campus at the prospect's own expense an unlimited number of times and may make an unofficial visit before the prospect's senior year in high school.
