CREDENTIALS & SCOUTING PASSES

All requests for working media credentials should be made to Jim Wrobel. Passes will be left at the will call window, which is located at the entrance to the Hart Center. Every effort will be made to accommodate all members of the media, but as space is limited, we may not be able to honor all requests.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Holy Cross has installed phone lines which can be rented by visiting radio. There is a charge of \$75.00 per line for commercial radio, or \$50.00 per line for student radio. Others wishing to install their own lines may contact Verizon Telephone at (508) 792-4000. Any radio station or reporting service seeking in-game or post-game reports must make arrangements through the athletic media relations office.

PARKING

Parking at the Hart Center is on a first-come, first-served basis. The parking lots in front of the Hart Center are ordinarily able to handle all of your parking needs. Members of the media are encouraged to arrive at least one hour before faceoff in order to ensure the availability of parking.

GAME DAY SERVICES

Pregame press notes and line charts are available in the press box approximately one hour before the game. A pregame meal will also be available approximately one hour before faceoff. Fax service is available after the game with advanced notice to the athletic media relations staff. Final statistics are provided. Complete books are available approximately 15 minutes after the game.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

The Holy Cross hockey locker room is closed to the media. Members of the media should submit player requests to Jim Wrobel by the five-minute mark of the third period. Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Holy Cross head coach Paul Pearl and requested players will be available outside of the locker room. Requests for interviews with the opposing team should be made with that school's sports information director.

COACH & PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Personal interviews with head coach Paul Pearl, his staff and players can be arranged through Jim Wrobel. Players are available in person and for phone interviews on most days, subject to the individual student-athlete's academic responsibilities. Arrangements for all interviews should be made at least 24 hours in advance. Home phone numbers will not be given out. The best time to reach coach Pearl by phone is on weekday mornings.

2012-2013 SEASON PREVIEW

The 2012-2013 Holy Cross men's hockey team returns 17 players from a squad that went 20-15-4 overall (15-8-4 Atlantic Hockey) last year for the sixth 20-win season in program history and the most wins since 2005-2006 when the Crusaders won a school record 27 games. The Crusaders also welcome 11 freshmen. HC will be looking to earn its third ever invitation to the NCAA Tournament.

Last year, the Crusaders led Atlantic Hockey with 120 goals and 3.08 goals per game as Holy Cross went 17-3-3 (.804) when scoring three or more goals. The Crusaders return four of their top five goal scorers as the team's offense is expected to be strong again this year. "A big strength of the team is our forwards," said head coach Paul Pearl. "We scored a lot of goals last year and have strong forwards returning."

The Crusaders' offense was spread out last season as 24 Crusaders had at least one point with 19 scoring at least one goal. This year's team is also expected to have a lot of depth. "Last year we had a lot of different players score goals and we need to continue that this season," said Pearl. "I think we have a lot of depth offensively. We have four strong lines that will make opposing teams have to decide which line to put their top defensive players against."

The team has been successful in finding the back of the net recently because of its ability to score different ways. "Last year our goals were from a couple of sources," said Pearl. "Primarily we were good on the power play. The second thing was we were really good at our rush offense. We were very good at attacking because our transition play was strong. We have a lot of great shooters and players who are good at rushing the net so that should help us score goals."

Defensively the Crusaders will be looking towards their veteran players but will also need to see major contributions from their freshmen defenders. "We graduated four seniors on defense that saw a significant amount of playing time," said Pearl. "We have a talented group of returning players and freshmen. A key to our success will be how quick our freshman defenders can adapt to college hockey. Our transition game depends on our defense so this will be very important."

Last season, the Crusaders ranked third on the power play in Atlantic Hockey and are expected to be strong again. "We have a lot of players who have seen a ton of ice time on the power play so that should be a strength," said Pearl. The Crusaders were fourth on the penalty kill in the league last year. "The penalty kill will be a work in progress because we will have a lot of new defenders playing on the penalty kill."

The Crusaders will be led by senior captain **Erik Vos (Carlisle, Ontario)** and senior assistant captain **Rob Linsmayer (Winnetka, Ill.)**. "Vos has a lot of maturity and poise," said Pearl. "He is really a guy that the other players look up to. When he needs to say something he will, and everyone will listen. Linsmayer is the ultimate lead by example captain. I have not had anyone who has played as hard as him. The work ethic he brings every day is great to watch. The players can see how much this team means to him and how much he cares."

The leadership of the senior class of **Kyle Fletcher (Kanata, Ontario)**, Linsmayer, **Brandon Nunn (Fairport, N.Y.)**, **Thomas Tysowsky (Amherst, N.Y.)**, Vos and senior **Evan Zych (Kilbride, Ontario)** will be very important this season. "The leadership of our seniors this year is huge because of the fact that we have 11 freshmen," said Pearl. "We need everyone to be a valuable member of the team and the seniors need to show that by leading by example."

The Crusaders will play a total of 17 home games at the Hart Center this season. Last year, Holy Cross went 12-3-2 at home. The Crusaders will also play a game at the New England Sports Center in Marlborough, Mass., versus Yale on Dec. 30. The Crusaders begin the regular season on the road versus AIC on Oct. 16. The home-opener is against UConn on Oct. 26.

FORWARDS RETURNING 10; LOST 5; FRESHMEN 6

The Crusaders return a veteran group of forwards. Last year's leader in goals and points, junior **Adam Schmidt (Warrington, Pa.)**, returns as he posted a career-best 18 goals and a career-best 37 points. He was second on the team with a career-best 19 assists. Schmidt earned second team All-Atlantic Hockey honors as he was the first Crusader to earn All-League accolades since 2008. Schmidt was also named the Hockey Commissioners' Association (HCA) National Division I Player of the Month for February. He already has 58 career points.

Vos is looking to continue where he left off last year as he also had a career-best season with 13 goals and 14 assists for 27 points. Nunn, who tied for second on the team with a career-best 15 goals last season, is also expected to have a strong senior year. Linsmayer, who has been a mainstay on the ice as he has played in all 114 games during his career, enters the season with 24 goals and 49 assists for 73 career points. Last season, Linsmayer tied for first in Atlantic Hockey with five game-winning goals.

Junior **Shayne Stockton (Rochester, N.Y.)** and Fletcher, who both missed some games last year due to injury, are expected to be a force on offense this season. Stockton has totaled 44 career points with 16 goals and 28 assists, while Fletcher has 23 goals and 33 assists for 56 points. Junior **Mark Williamson (Centennial, Colo.)**, and sophomores **Mike McNamara (Chestnut Hill, Mass.)**, **Jake Youso (International Falls, Minn.)** and **Tommy Dwyer (Ridgefield, Conn.)** are also expected to have strong seasons. Freshmen **Brandon Adams (Prospect Heights, Ill.)**, **Tim Driscoll (Hingham, Mass.)**, **Sean Gustin (Stoneham, Mass.)**, **Brett Lubanski (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, **Castan Sommer (Shrewsbury, Mass.)** and **Matt Vidal (Manorville, N.Y.)** will be looking to contribute right away.

DEFENSEMEN RETURNING 4; LOST 5; FRESHMEN 5

The Crusaders return four defensemen and welcome five freshmen. With the graduation of four defensemen who all saw a ton of ice time last season, the Crusaders will need major contributions from their defense. The Crusaders return Zych, junior **Jeffrey Reppucci (Newburyport, Mass.)**, junior **Ryan McGrath (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** and sophomore **Nilan Nagy (Canonsburg, Pa.)** to the roster as they have all been key contributors. Freshmen **Karl Beckman (Okemos, Mich.)**, **Jake Bolton (Ellington, Conn.)**, **Nathaniel Domagala (Oakville, Ontario)**, **Ben Kaplan (Burlington, Vt.)** and **Joe McNamara (Chestnut Hill, Mass.)** are also expected to have strong freshman seasons.

GOALTENDERS RETURNING 3; LOST 0; FRESHMEN 0

A strength for the Crusaders will be their depth in goal. Sophomore goalie **Matt Ginn (Lindsey, Ontario)**, who was named the HCA's National Rookie of the Month for February last year, was named the Atlantic Hockey Rookie of the Week three times, Rookie of the Month twice and Goalie of the Week once. He went 17-8-2 as his 17 wins were tied for second on the school's Division I single-season list. His 629 saves were sixth all-time for a Division I season, while his 2.42 goals against average was fourth. Junior **Derek Kump (Falmouth, Maine)** and Tysowsky also bring experience to the position. Kump, who has missed some time due to injury, has been solid in goal over his first two seasons. Tysowsky enters the season tied for third on the school's all-time Division I career victories list with 18 wins. His 1,280 career saves rank third on the school's all-time Division I career saves list and his 2.88 goals against average ranks fourth.

PAUL PEARL HEAD COACH

Paul Pearl is in his 18th season at the helm of the Holy Cross men's ice hockey program in 2012-2013, and is just the fifth head coach in the history of ice hockey at Holy Cross. On January 21, 2006, with a 3-2 victory at Dartmouth, Pearl became the school's all-time winningest coach with the 168th victory of his career.

Pearl has forged a 263-257-63 record at Holy Cross over 17 years and has been the man behind the bench in eight of the 10 most successful seasons in Holy Cross history, while he has had four teams post 20-plus win seasons. Along with 16 post-season appearances in 18 years, Pearl led the Crusaders to their first two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003-2004 and 2005-2006, while he coached the Crusaders to their first ever NCAA Tournament win with the 4-3 overtime victory over Minnesota in Grand Forks, N.D., on March 24, 2006.

Last season, the Crusaders went 20-15-4 overall for the sixth 20-win season in program history. The Crusaders' 15-8-4 Atlantic Hockey record was their best since going 19-7-2 in 2005-2006.

Pearl was named the Atlantic Hockey Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in the 2010-2011 season, after the Crusaders went 17-16-5 overall (14-8-5 Atlantic Hockey). The Crusaders set a new school record with a 12-game unbeaten streak as Holy Cross went 9-0-3 between Jan. 22-March 11, which also included seven consecutive victories. The previous school record came when the team went 10-0-0 between Dec. 8, 1979-Jan. 16, 1980. The Crusaders made it to the Atlantic Hockey semifinals for the first time since the 2005-2006 season.

In 2005-2006, Pearl led the Crusaders to a school single season record 27 victories, as the team posted an overall record of 27-10-2. Holy Cross also claimed the Atlantic Hockey regular season and tournament titles.

During the 2003-2004 campaign, the Crusaders tallied a 22-10-4 overall record. Holy Cross swept the Atlantic Hockey tournament, and captured two shutout victories en route to the title, including the 5-0 play-off win versus American International (3/13/04) and in the 4-0 championship game win over Sacred Heart (3/20/04).

In 1998-1999, the Crusaders earned a 22-9-4 mark and the MAAC hockey championship. It was the first time in the school's history that the hockey program won its conference championship.

In Pearl's first season (1994-1995), he inherited a team that had one winning season in its eight previous years. He guided the squad to a 15-10 record, including an 11-4 mark at the Hart Center and an ECAC Tournament berth.

Over the years, Pearl has coached several talented athletes, including 1999 MAAC Goalie of the Year Scott Simpson, 2002 MAAC Offensive Player of the Year and former New York Ranger Patrick Rissmiller, 2003-2004 Atlantic Hockey Defensive Forward of Year Greg Kealey, 2003-2004 Atlantic Hockey Individual Sportsmanship honoree Tim Coskren, 2005-2006 All-American Tyler McGregor, Holy Cross' all-time Division I points leader James Sixsmith and the 2006-2007 Atlantic Hockey Defenseman of the Year Jon Landry. Not only have Pearl's athletes received numerous accolades, but the coach himself has earned several honors, such as the 2003-2004 and 2010-2011 Atlantic Hockey Coach of the Year award, the 2001-2002 MAAC Coach of the Year award, the 1997-1998 ECAC East Coach of the Year award and the 1997-1998 New England Hockey Writers Coach of Year honor.

Pearl also served Holy Cross in the capacity of baseball coach from 1998-2001. He coached the first two teams to ever reach the Patriot League baseball playoffs at Holy Cross and was twice named Patriot League Coach of the Year.

A 1989 graduate of Holy Cross, Pearl served as an assistant coach at the University of Connecticut from 1992-1994. While at Connecticut, Pearl helped lead the Huskies to an impressive mark of 34-15-5 and a

pair of ECAC Tournament appearances. Pearl also served as assistant coach at Brown University, gaining valuable recruiting experience in the United States and Canada. Also at Brown he served as the head men's golf coach.

Prior to serving as an assistant at Connecticut, Pearl directed the ice hockey program at the Portsmouth Abbey School in Portsmouth, R.I., for two seasons. He works extensively with USA Hockey in the Massachusetts Satellite program and has served as assistant coach several times, including the Massachusetts Select 17 squad that captured gold at the St. Cloud Festival in Minnesota.

As a four-year letterwinner for the Crusaders, he played in 125 games as a defenseman, tallying 14 goals and 63 assists. Pearl led Holy Cross with 25 assists as a senior captain on the 1988-1989 squad. During his four-year playing-career, Holy Cross won 63 games and qualified for the ECAC East Tournament twice.

Jason Smith is in his sixth season as an assistant coach at Holy Cross in 2012-2013. Smith serves as the recruiting coordinator and works with all positions with an emphasis on forwards.

Smith came to Holy Cross from Babson College, where he was as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for four seasons. Babson won the ECAC East Championship in 2007 and earned its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1993. Jason Guerriero is in his second season as an assistant coach at Holy Cross in 2012-2013. He is a former Northeastern captain and first team All-American.

Guerriero is a 2005 graduate of Northeastern where he had an outstanding career with 49 goals and 98 assists for 147 points, including a career-best 17 goals and 31 assists for 48 points as a senior. He was the first ever Northeastern player to lead Hockey East in scoring. During his career, he earned numerous honors including first team All-America, first team All-Hockey East, Northeastern Male Athlete of the Year, Hockey East Len Ceglarski Sportsmanship Award, Hockey East 25th Anniversary All-Northeastern team, New England Hockey All-Star, Walter Brown Award runner-up and Northeastern Rookie of the Year.

Following graduation, Guerriero went on to have a six-year professional hockey career, including two seasons as a member of the Milwaukee Admirals of the American Hockey League. He played 137 career games with the Admirals as he recorded 23 goals and 52 assists for 75 points. Guerriero also served as an assistant captain of the team during the 2007-2008 season. He also attended the training camps of the New York Islanders and the Nashville Predators. In addition, Guerriero also played for teams in Finland, Austria, Switzerland, Germany and Denmark. 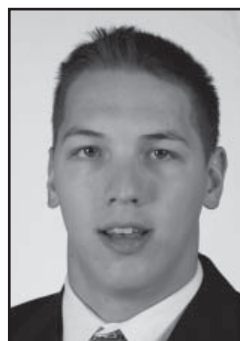

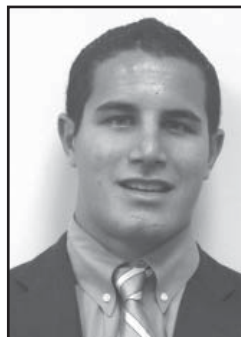

In Holy Cross' first appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the Crusaders fell to North Dakota 3-0 at the World Arena. Holy Cross kept the puck in the North Dakota end for the first 30 seconds of the opening period but North Dakota's Zach Parise stole the puck and gave the Fighting Sioux a 1-0 lead. Parise came in on a breakaway and carried the puck around a sprawling Tony Quesada to give North Dakota the early advantage. The Crusaders refused to buckle, and came roaring back against the top ranked team in the NCAA tournament. Holy Cross fired six shots at Fighting Sioux goaltender Jordan Parise in the opening period. Holy Cross' best opportunity to score came midway through the period when Andrew McKay had a clean shot on goal that was stuck aside. In the second period, North Dakota tacked on another goal when it converted on a power play with 18:23 gone in the stanza. Brandon Bochenski blasted a one-timer off of a pass from Parise. The Crusaders notched just three shots in the second period but carried much of the play at times. Quesada continued to sparkle early in the third period stopping several point blank shots until the Fighting Sioux slipped one by him midway through the period. Quesada finished the day with 30 saves. Holy Cross racked up 21 shots on goal for the game but was unable to score.

2006 NCAA West Regional Semifinals Holy Cross 4, Minnesota 3 (OT)

March 24, 2006 • Grand Forks, N.D.

Tyler McGregor scored the game-winning goal 53 seconds into sudden death overtime, to give Holy Cross a 4-3 victory over Minnesota at Ralph Engelstad Arena. With the win, the Crusaders became the first No. 4 seed to ever defeat a No. 1 seed in NCAA action. The Crusaders took a 1-0 lead at the 8:49 mark of the second period when Dale Reinhardt scored his 11th goal of the season. Blair Bartlett took the puck off a Minnesota turnover at the right face-off circle and dropped it off to Reinhardt who then buried it into the upper right corner. The Golden Gophers tied the game at 13:15 when Mike Howe scored a shorthanded goal. Howe fired a shot that hit the left post and then he buried his own rebound. The Crusaders answered right back 31 seconds later when McGregor scored his first goal of the game and 25th of the season on a five-on-three power play. James Sixsmith sent a crossing pass from the right side to McGregor on the left, who then fired a shot into the inside left corner of the net. Minnesota tied the game at 2-2 two minutes later with a breakaway goal by Phil Kessel. Evan Kaufmann sent a pass to Kessel who had just left the penalty box and then skated in all alone for the goal. The Golden Gophers took a 3-2 lead 2:17 into the third period when Alex Gogligoski blasted a shot into top left corner. Holy Cross tied the game at 3-3 when Pierre Napert-Frenette netted his 16th goal of the year. Sean Nappo hit the post with a shot, before Napert-Frenette jumped on the rebound for the goal. McGregor's game winner just 53 seconds into overtime came when he knocked in his own rebound after a Minnesota defender blocked his crossing pass for his 26th goal of the year.

Jim Tselikis took possession of the puck between the face-off circles after a North Dakota turnover and dropped the puck to Werry in the middle of the left face-off circle, who then fired in a slap shot past Jordan Parise. North Dakota regained its two-goal lead at the 17:23 mark when Matt Smaby scored a power play goal. Smaby pounced on a loose puck in front of the net and was able to knock it into the goal. The Crusaders had seven shots and went 0-2 on the power play, while the Fighting Sioux had 12 shots and went 1-2. Holy Cross made it a 3-2 game when Blair Bartlett scored his 13th goal of the season at the 5:21 mark of the third period while on the power play. The Holy Cross hockey team moved into its own home in the fall of 1975. From its opening on Dec. 2, 1975, to its around-the-clock operation today, the Hart Recreation Center has been a model of excellence for other rinks to emulate.

The Hart Center was erected in honor of the late Rev. Francis J. Hart, S.J., who was the guiding force behind the intramural athletic competition at Holy Cross for several decades.

In the summer of 2006, the Hart Center was renovated as a brand new ice surface, boards and higher glass were put in, along with new scoreboards.

The Crusaders' locker room facility was renovated in 2007 with all new lockers. The locker room features a players' lounge and state-of-the-art video equipment. The team's weight room is located adjacent to the hockey rink.

Over the years, the Hart Center has set the stage for battles against the likes of Boston College, the University of Maine, Merrimack
