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MASCOT & COLOR

“CRUSADERS” - The name “Crusader” was first associated with Holy Cross in 1884 at an alumni banquet in Boston, where an engraved Crusader mounted on an armored horse appeared at the head of the menu. The name was rediscovered by Stanley Woodward, a sports reporter for the Boston Herald, when he used the term “Crusader” to describe the Holy Cross baseball team in a story written in 1925. The name appealed to the Holy Cross student body, which held a vote later in that year to decide whether this cognomen or one of the other two currently in use - “Chiefs” and “Sagamores” - would be adopted. The Tomahawk of Oct. 6, 1925, reported that the results of the ballot were: Crusaders 143, Chiefs 17, Sagamores 7.

PURPLE - The official color for the College of the Holy Cross is purple, which comes from the motto “In Hoc Signo Vinces” on the purple labarum (military standard) of King Constantine the Great (born about 275 A.D., died in 337 A.D.)

Elvis Comrie is in his 17th season as the head coach of the Crusaders. Comrie has the most career wins (108) of any men's soccer coach in the history of the program and he is the most tenured coach in the history of Holy Cross soccer.

In the past 13 seasons Comrie has guided the Crusaders to nine Patriot League Tournaments, including a string of seven straight appearances from 1997-2003.

Comrie led Holy Cross to a 13-5-1 overall record in 2002 and the Patriot League regular season and tournament championships for the first time in school history. The 13 wins marked the most victories in the 38-year history of the men's soccer program at Holy Cross. That season, Comrie led the Crusaders to their first NCAA Tournament appearance, where they lost to Fairleigh Dickinson on penalty kicks. The Crusaders finished third in the NSCAA/adidas Division I poll for the New England region, after earning the school's first national Top 25 ranking on October 14, 2002. Holy Cross also won its second consecutive Patriot League regular season championship in 2002, after winning the regular season title in 2001 with a 10-5-2 (6-0-1 Patriot League) record.

In 1995, Comrie guided Holy Cross to one of the most successful seasons in school history. The Crusaders became just the second team in Patriot League history to go undefeated in conference play (5-0-1). After opening the season with a 1-0 loss to eventual NCAA champion Wisconsin, the Crusaders reeled off eight straight wins to climb to the top of the league standings. For his efforts Comrie was named the 1995 Patriot League Coach of the Year by his peers, an award he also received in 1999 and 2001 after Holy Cross finished first in the conference in the regular season with unbeaten records (5-0-1 in 1999 and 6-0-1 in 2001). In 2001, Holy Cross hosted the Patriot League men's soccer championship tournament for the third time.

Comrie took over the Crusader program in 1991, and in just three years turned the program into a New England contender. His 1993 squad, featuring five sophomores and five freshmen in the starting lineup, won nine games and earned Holy Cross a Top-10 New England ranking for the first time since 1985. Holy Cross improved to 10 wins the following year, finishing seventh in the final New England poll.

Comrie came to Mount St. James with an extensive background as a player, coach and administrator. As an assistant coach under Shaun Green

at Central Connecticut from 1989-1990, he helped the Blue Devils to a 25-13-1 record. In 1989, Central Connecticut went 15-3 and earned a top five ranking in New England.

As a collegiate player, Comrie was a four-year starter for the University of Connecticut, leading the Huskies to the NCAA national championship in 1981. Over the course of his career, he received All-America, All-New England and All-Yankee Conference honors, as well as being named Collegiate Player of the Year in 1981 by *Soccer America*. He is currently the second all-time leading scorer at UConn with 145 career points.

Comrie also was successful on the professional and international circuits. In 1982 he was the runner up for NASL Rookie of the Year honors as a member of the Montreal Manic in the first of his nine professional seasons. He earned NASL All-Star honors in 1984 when he helped lead the Chicago Sting to the NASL Championship. He played internationally in France, as well as playing for the United States National Team.

Comrie was inducted into the Connecticut Hall of Fame in 2005.

Assistant Coach

First Season

John Trice is in his first season as a men's soccer assistant coach at Holy Cross.

A 2004 graduate of James Madison, Trice was a four-year member of the soccer team. He was a team captain as a senior and a starting defensive center-midfielder as a junior and senior. Trice earned the Coaches Award for his junior and senior seasons, while he was a three-time Verizon Scholar Athlete. His team won the 2001 Colonial Athletic Association championship, while they earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament in 2000 and 2001. He was also a member of the Student Athletic Advisory Committee.

Since 2004, Trice has been an assistant property manager / leasing consultant for Post Properties Inc, while also serving as trainer for Tamir Linhart Golden Boot Soccer in McLean, Va., and working as a soccer camp instructor at numerous soccer camps.



Holy Cross returns nine starters and 18 letterwinners this season, including four of the top six scorers from the 2006 team. With a group of experienced players, the team feels a sense of excitement to come out strong in 2007.

"The team was very young last year," said head coach **Elvis Comrie**. "In order to achieve success you have to go through growing pains. I expect a major improvement from last year. The experience learned from last season will prove to be beneficial this year."

The large class of seven juniors will be expected to impact the team this season. "We're dependant on the junior class to step up and show leadership and produce the goods to have a productive season," said Comrie.

In 2006, six different players scored goals, 12 different players recorded assists, and all but four of those point-scorers are returning this season.

Holy Cross also welcomes 11 incoming freshmen to the 2007 squad. "The incoming class will give quality that we didn't have last year, particularly from a defensive stand point," said Comrie.

FORWARDS

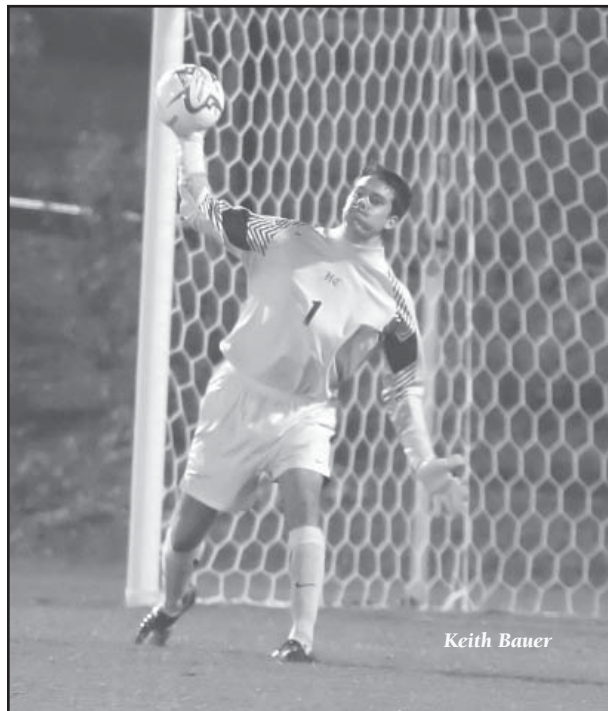
Up front, the Crusaders will look to junior co-captain **Felipe Castrillon** for leadership. Last year, Castrillon was second on the team with seven goals scored. He added one assist for 15 points and had two game-winning goals.

Seniors **Marsalis Beckford** and **Sefton Kincaid** should be two other key players for Holy Cross. Kincaid recorded seven points on one goal and a team-best five assists last season, while Beckford totaled six points on two goals and two assists. Sophomore **Wesley Laine** and freshmen **Kyle Miller** and **Alex Schweitzer** will also look to contribute.

MIDFIELDERS

Junior **Andreas Andrews** looks to play a big role for the Crusaders in the midfield, after gaining valuable experience with 11 starts last season. Andrews totaled four assists in 2006, to rank second on the team.

Sophomores **Franco Bacigalupo** and **Ryan O'Hanlon** should be two other important players for Holy Cross in 2007. Freshmen **Matthew Beckley**, **Diego Castaneda**, **Philippe Candido**, **Jonathan Werth** and **Thomas Wilhelm** will also look to break into the lineup.

DEFENDERS

The defense should be a huge strength for the Crusaders, as four starters return from last season. Junior co-captain **Jerry Dickinson**, who will be in his third year as a starter, looks to lead the way. In addition to his outstanding defensive play, Dickinson added two goals and one assist last year.

Senior **Chidie Okpoebo** and junior **Alejandro Melean** are two other players who started all 17 games in 2006, with Okpoebo recording two assists and Melean adding one assist. Junior **Kregory Hefner**, who had one assist in 14 starts last season, looks to round out the starting lineup.

Junior **Peter Siclari**, sophomore **Peter Whooley** and freshmen **Henry Hulick**, **James Imbriani**, **Paul Tearson** and **Tom Van Grinsven** will also look to contribute on defense.

GOALKEEPERS

Holy Cross returns all three goalkeepers off last year's roster, led by junior **Keith Bauer**. In 2006, Bauer posted a 5-6 record in 11 starts, while recording 36 saves and two shutouts. Sophomores **Thomas Booth** and **David LeBar** will continue to add depth to the position after gaining experience in their freshman year. Booth started six times in 2006 and made 29 saves, while LeBar had one save in two appearances.

"I'm excited about this year because we have a lot more experience in goal," said Comrie.

SCHEDULE

Holy Cross is scheduled to play 17 regular season games this year, including eight home contests at the Linda Johnson Smith Soccer Stadium and four games against teams which advanced to the 2006 NCAA Tournament (Bucknell, Harvard, Lehigh and Providence).

In non-conference action, the Crusaders will face Boston College, Manhattan, Quinnipiac and Sacred Heart at home, while traveling to Harvard, Maine, New Hampshire, Northeastern, Providence and Siena.

When Patriot League play begins, Holy Cross will take on American, Colgate, Lafayette and Lehigh at home, and face Army, Bucknell and Navy on the road.

The Patriot League Tournament is set for Nov. 16-18.

LINDA JOHNSON SMITH SOCCER STADIUM

The new 1,320 seat Linda Johnson Smith Soccer Stadium officially opened in the fall of 2006, for the beginning of the 2006 soccer season. The first regular season game played at the stadium was between the Holy Cross women's soccer team and Providence on Aug. 25, 2006, while the official blessing and dedication was held on Sept. 8, 2006, prior to the men's game with St. Bonaventure. The stadium is located behind the Hart Center, and serves as the first-ever permanent home for Crusader soccer.

The surface of the field is natural grass, with spectator seating on both sides of the field. The stadium also has permanent lights, allowing both the men's and women's soccer teams to play home games at night for the first time in school history. It also includes a press box at the top of the bleachers, with space for the public address announcer, media and a VIP section.

A successful fundraising campaign raised funds to support construction of the facility and indoor changing / meeting rooms for the men's and women's teams in the Hart Center.

The stadium is the first new playing facility on campus since the debut of the lighted artificial turf field and running track in 1988.

As the stadium is located adjacent to the turf field and track, spectator stands were built on both sides, accommodating fans at both facilities.

"Building a new stadium is a reflection of the school's commitment to the students and student-athletes," said men's head coach Elvis Comrie. "It gives us a place to be proud of and call our own, and it reflects positively on us as a program, as it now puts us on par with everyone else at the Division I level."

Construction began in the Spring of 2005 and a few months later, on May 19, 2005, the Linda Johnson Smith Soccer Stadium was introduced at a small groundbreaking ceremony behind the Hart Center. Linda Johnson Smith is wife and business partner of Park B. Smith (Class of 1954), and both were leading contributors to the major fundraising campaign for construction of the stadium.

In addition to the Smiths, major contributors in attendance at the groundbreaking were: Michael Greene (Class of 1984); Sean (Class of 1976) and Cathy (Class of 1977) O'Neil; Tim Egan (Class of 1977); and Chris (Class of 1980) and Cathy (Class of 1980) Collins.

The cost of the facility was in excess of \$2 million. The money was raised through a fundraising campaign, as part of the Lift High the Cross Campaign, which seeks to enhance Holy Cross' place among the nation's premier liberal arts colleges.



SMITH WELLNESS CENTER

Opened in 1997, the Carol and Park B. Smith Wellness Center is a two-story facility which was built as an addition to the Hart Recreation Center. The Wellness Center provides state-of-the-art fitness equipment for varsity athletes and all other members of the Holy Cross community.

A \$1.5 million gift from Carol and Park B. Smith '54 kicked off the campaign to fund the facility. "Everyone today agrees that fitness is very important," Smith said. "I'm confident that this Wellness center - whose facilities will be second-to-none - will provide a real benefit to current and future Holy Cross students, teachers and staff."

With 15,000 square feet, the Wellness Center provides over four times more space than the College previously had for varsity and community exercise and training, and centralizes athletic equipment and facilities once found in five locations in three campus buildings.

On the first level, the center houses a highly versatile strength and conditioning center for Holy Cross' 650 student-athletes. There are areas for speed development programs, as well as for strength and endurance conditioning. The space, which is able to accommodate as many as 60 people at a time, enables Holy Cross' larger sports teams to work out together, thereby enhancing team unity.

The second floor has been designed for use by all students, faculty and staff. It has two sections: one for aerobic training, and the other for cardiovascular, variable-resistance and strength training. A diverse selection of equipment accommodates users ranging from beginners to advanced athletes. Its south facing wall is mostly glass, allowing most users a view of the practice fields and the rolling hills of central New England.

The center also offers programs that explore the connections between fitness and wellness, and help students learn how good health can compliment and enhance other aspects of their educational experience.

An advisory board comprising physicians, fitness and strength trainers, faculty members, psychologists, nutritionists, a College chaplain, and others are responsible for creating and coordinating programming for the Center.

With 6,500 square feet of the Center devoted solely to varsity athletes, a much greater number of athletes can be accommodated at one time, and teams can train together at times more convenient to their busy schedules as student-athletes.

The state-of-the-art equipment in the Wellness Center includes eight multi-purpose power racks, each with over 600 pounds of free weights; seven Olympic lifting platforms with over 375 pounds of rubberized free weights, more than 3000 pounds of dumbbells, 18 pieces of aerobic equipment, three full sets of plyometric boxes and a number of free weight-loaded pieces of equipment to accommodate injured athletes.



Holy Cross is renowned for its academic excellence and mentoring-based, liberal arts education in the Jesuit tradition. An exclusively undergraduate institution with just over 2,700 students, Holy Cross is the oldest Catholic college in New England. Founded in 1843 in Worcester, Mass., the campus occupies 174 beautifully landscaped acres, featuring traditional and contemporary architecture, state-of-the-art facilities, and striking views from atop Mount St. James.

Academic life at Holy Cross is serious, challenging and exciting. Student-professor exchanges in the classroom, as well as in countless informal settings, are at the center of academic life at Holy Cross. With a student to faculty ratio of 11 to one, the opportunity for individual attention is readily available. Few classes exceed an enrollment of 40, and most average 19 students.

Holy Cross professors are widely respected in their academic specialties. Many have national reputations for their research and publications, creative performances, recordings and exhibitions. Almost all of the nearly 300 full- and part-time faculty members hold doctoral degrees from some of the finest universities here and abroad.

Among the major academic facilities on campus are Dinand Library (which, along with three other specialized libraries on campus, has total holdings of more than 650,000 volumes); Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Art Gallery (with a regular schedule of world-class exhibitions); Brooks Concert Hall (acclaimed by performers and acoustical experts as one of the finest medium-sized performance spaces in the region); St. Joseph Memorial Chapel (built in 1924 and containing the recently renovated McCooley Chapel on the lower level); Hogan Campus Center (with bookstore, post office, coffee lounge, cafeteria and pub); Carol and Park B. Smith Hall (housing the Center for Religion, Ethics and Culture and the Rehm Library); the Multimedia Resource Center in Edith Stein Hall; and the science complex in Haberlin, O'Neil and Swords Halls.

Coeducational since 1972, Holy Cross enrolls a student body of proven accomplishment. Almost all graduated in the top 20 percent of their high school classes. Most live in 10 residence halls on campus, all fully connected to the college's computer network. Students, elected by their peers, represent their classmates at faculty meetings, on major college committees, and in a consultative capacity on the appointment and promotion of faculty. There are more than 100 co-curricular offerings on campus and diverse opportunities for innovative academic options such as the first-year program, community-based learning, Washington semester, internships and full-year study abroad.



Holy Cross integrates faith and knowledge with an emphasis on service, in keeping with the Jesuits' commitment to educate "men and women for others." A distinguishing and all-important characteristic of education at Holy Cross is the emphasis placed upon the service of faith and the promotion of justice. The Office of the College Chaplains advises Student Programs for Urban Development (SPUD), which is the largest student organization on campus. More than 450 students are involved in 37 direct-service programs in Worcester.

CORRESPONDENCE

It is important for prospective student-athletes to get in touch with head coach Elvis Comrie as soon as possible. A simple letter of inquiry into the men's soccer program will initiate the recruiting process. The most appropriate time to contact coach is during your junior year.

INTERVIEWS

Students are strongly encouraged to have admissions interviews. The office offers interviews from the summer **until January 15**. Alumni interviews in most metropolitan areas are available. Students must first submit an application and indicate they would like an alumni interview before **December 15**.

EARLY DECISION

Students who are absolutely, 100% confident Holy Cross is their top college choice are encouraged to apply during the Early Decision process.

FINANCIAL AID

All financial aid is awarded on the basis of need. Prospective student-athletes should complete the CSS "Profile Form" in early Fall.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATION

The NCAA Eligibility Center certifies academic eligibility and amateurism for all prospective student-athletes who wish to compete in intercollegiate athletics at the Division I or II level. Prospective student-athletes must register at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net and complete the online release form. Prospective student-athletes must arrange for the appropriate national testing agency to send copies of standardized test scores (e.g., SAT or ACT) directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center. Prospects must also complete the amateurism questionnaire. An institution may not provide an official visit to a prospective student-athlete until he or she registers with the NCAA Eligibility Center.

CALENDAR:

A typical recruiting calendar for a prospective student-athlete interested in soccer would go something like this:

**** Spring/Summer of 2007 --** make unofficial visits to schools of interest and contact Head Coach Elvis Comrie if Holy Cross falls within your top-five list of potential colleges.

**** Summer of 2007--** Head Coach Elvis Comrie will be in contact regarding student-athlete's interest and possible visit date.

**** December 15 --** Deadline for Admissions Early Decision.

**** January 15 --** Deadline for Admissions Regular Decision.

December 15 - Early Decision

December 15 - Last day to request alumni interview (application needs to be postmarked by this date)

January 15 - Regular Decision

January 15 - Last day for on-campus interviews

TELEPHONE CALLS

As per NCAA by law 13.1.3.1, institutional staff members may not telephone a prospect (or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians) prior to July 1 following the prospect's completion of the junior year in high school. After July 1, institutional staff members may telephone a prospect once per week (measured Sunday through Saturday). The once-per-week limit applies to the entire institution.

VIDEO TAPES

In an attempt to make an accurate assessment as soon as possible, it is recommended that videotapes be forwarded to head coach Elvis Comrie's attention as soon as possible. The video need not be an elaborate production. Some simple game or practice tape is sufficient with you being easily identified.

CONTACTS

As per NCAA by law 13.02.3, a contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's parent or legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of a greeting. Any such face-to-face encounter that is prearranged or takes place on the grounds of the prospect's high school, or at the site of organized competition or practice involving the prospect's high school, preparatory school, two-year college, or all-star team is considered a contact, regardless of the conversation that occurs. We are limited to three off-campus contacts per prospective student-athlete.

EVALUATIONS

As per NCAA by law 13.02.6.1, an evaluation is any off-campus activity designed to assess the academic qualifications or athletic ability of a prospect, including any visit to a prospect's educational institution (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of a prospect participating in any practice or competition at any size. We are limited in our number of evaluations per prospective student-athlete.

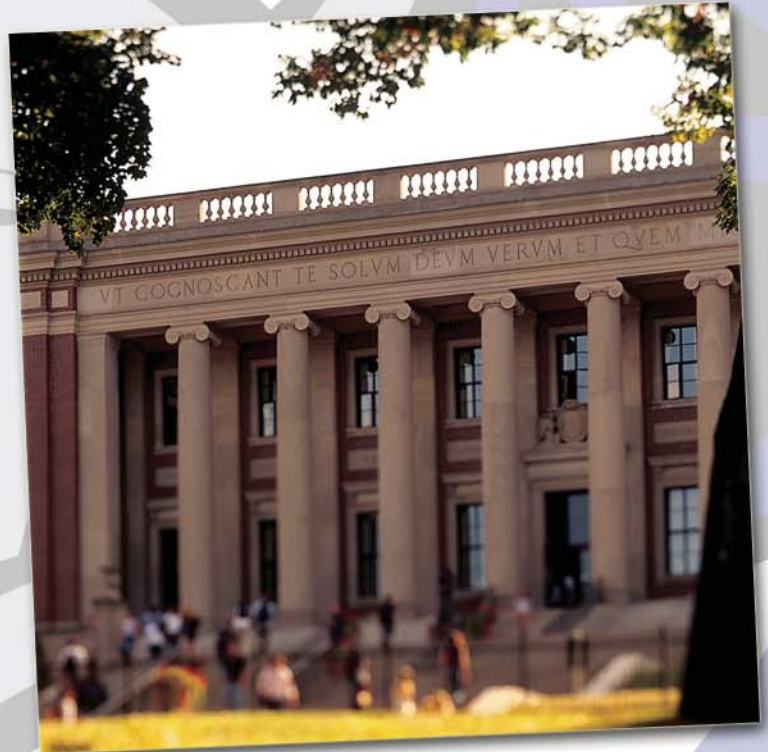
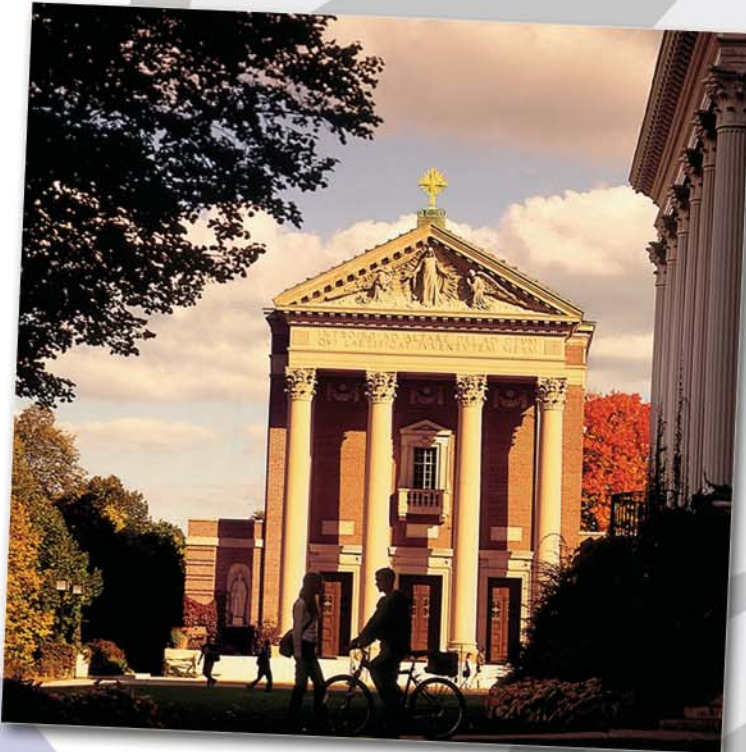
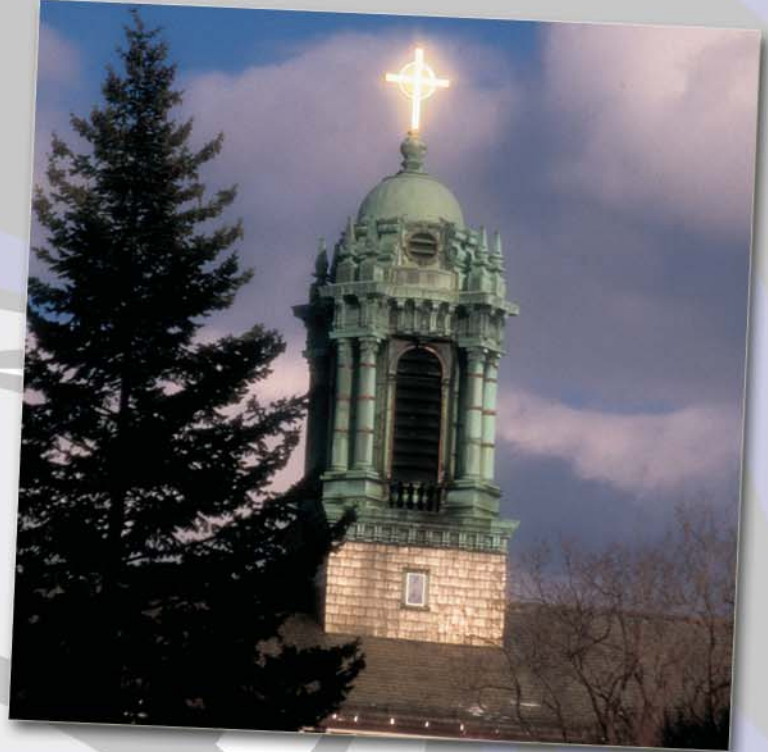
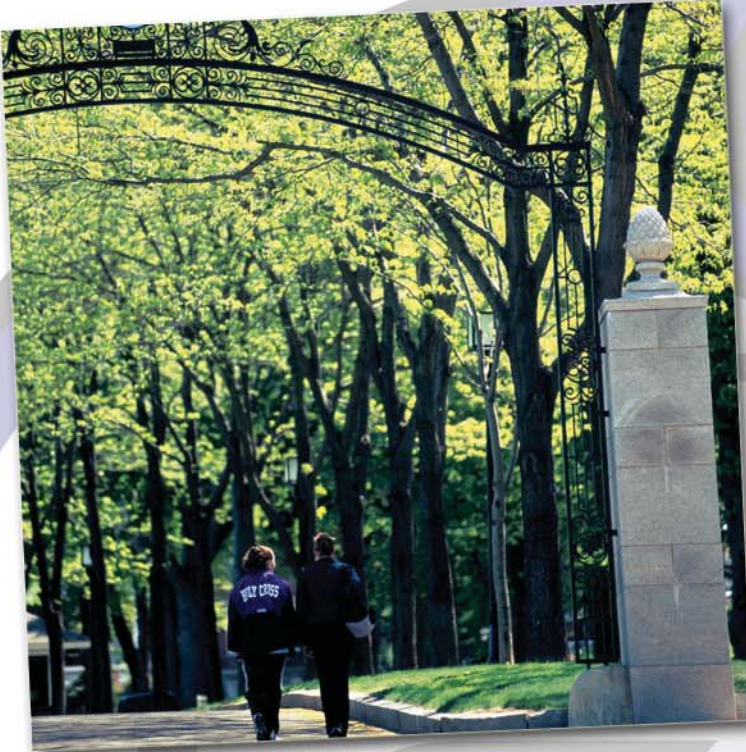
OFFICIAL VISITS

According to NCAA by law 13.7.1.2, a prospect may not make more than five expense-paid visits to NCAA member institutions, regardless of the number of sports in which the prospect is involved. An institution may not provide an expense-paid visit to a prospect who has not presented the institution with a high school (or college) academic transcript and a score from a PSAT, an SAT, a PACTPlus, or an ACT test taken on a national testing date under national testing conditions.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

According to NCAA by law 13.8.1, a prospect may visit an institution's campus at the prospect's own expense an unlimited number of times and may make an unofficial visit before the prospect's senior year in high school.
