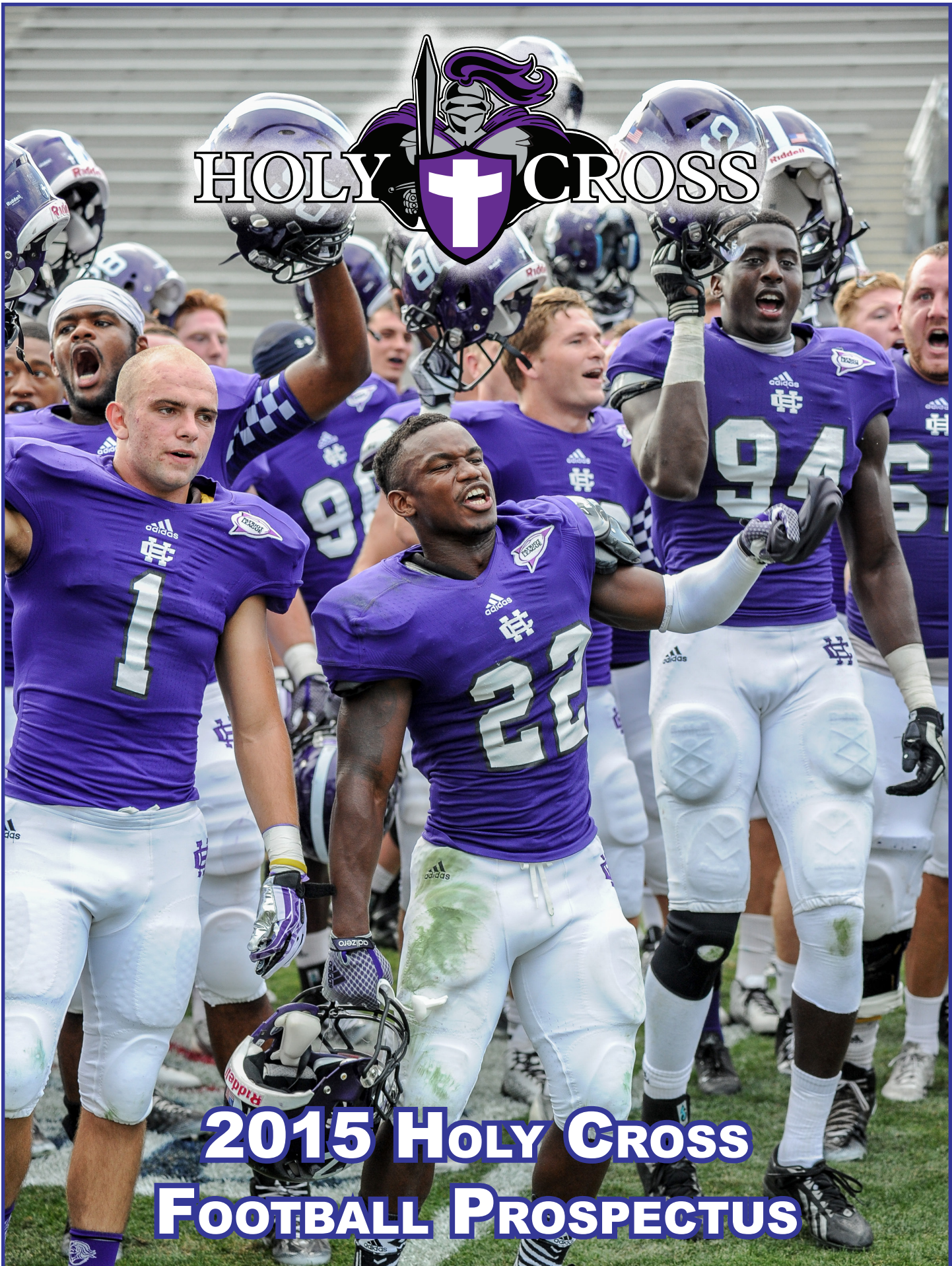

2015 SPRING OUTLOOK

Coming off a 2014 campaign in which it finished with an overall record of 4-8 and a 2-4 mark against Patriot League foes, the Holy Cross football team enters spring practice looking to build a team which can challenge for the conference title in 2015. The Crusaders were in nearly every game last fall, as six of team's eight losses came by seven points or less, including two overtime contests. In addition, last year's final two deep chart included 18 freshmen and sophomores.

On the offensive side of the ball, Holy Cross returns seven starters and most of its key skill position players. That group will look to build on what they did a year ago, averaging 362.7 yards of total offense and 21.0 first downs per game. Even though four starters need to be replaced, Holy Cross looks to put one of the top offenses in the Patriot League on the field this season.

As for the defense, the Crusaders have eight starters back on a unit which could develop into one of the top defenses in the Patriot League. Holy Cross gave up 381.2 yards and 24.2 points per game in 2014. The Crusaders will look to improve upon those numbers in 2015, with several experienced players returning.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of how Holy Cross should look in 2015.



OFFENSE

Junior **Peter Pujals** returns to lead the Crusaders' offense this season, after earning second team All-Patriot League honors in 2014. Pujals completed 225 of 375 passes for 2,353 yards and 10 touchdowns a year ago, in addition to rushing the ball 170 times for 705 yards and six scores. He finished the season ranked third in the Patriot League in passing yards and total offense, fourth in passing efficiency and sixth in rushing yards.

Sophomore **Blaise Bell** and sophomore **James McHale** will look to gain added experience in the system during spring practice, while pushing Pujals.

The Crusaders will return three of their top four wide receivers from last season, led by junior **Jake Wieczorek**. Last season, Wieczorek led the team with 50 catches for 694 yards and five touchdowns, and ranked sixth in the conference in receiving yards while being named second team All-Patriot League.

Senior **Kalif Raymond** also returns to the starting lineup for Holy Cross this year. Raymond finished the 2014 campaign with 39 receptions for 305 yards and two scores, and ranked eighth in the Patriot League in receptions. Junior **Brendan Flaherty** should also be a major threat, after moving over from running back last season. Flaherty totaled 30 catches for 309 yards and one touchdown in 2014.

Several other players should be key contributors at wide receiver, including senior **Zach Buzzard**, sophomore **Andre Harton** and sophomore **Darrius Lacy**. Senior **Andrew Rhodes**, senior **Don Webber**, sophomore **Alex Bledsoe** and sophomore **Matt Millett** will also look to earn increased playing time this spring.

In the offensive backfield, junior **Gabe Guild** returns as the starter for Holy Cross at tailback. Guild rushed 131 times for 588 yards and five touchdowns last year, in addition to catching 15 passes for 104 yards. He will be pushed by sophomore **Diquan Walker** in the battle for playing time. Walker ran the ball 69 times for 283 yards and three scores in 2014. Senior **Alex Waked** will also look to become a factor at tailback, while sophomore **Tim Smith** will provide a presence at fullback.

Junior **Lucas Nikolaisen** will look to become a key weapon at tight end, after earning eight starts last season. Nikolaisen finished the 2014 campaign with 12 catches for 106 yards. Sophomore **Jayke Simsheuser** should also become more of a factor, after playing in all 12 games last year with two starts. Junior **Mark McGuire**, who has been a key contributor on special teams, will look to see more action on offense.

On the offensive line, the Crusaders return two starters from a year ago. Last season the line paved the way for Holy Cross to rush for 1,884 yards as a team, its highest total since running for 1,927 yards in 1991. Leading the way will be juniors **Hunter Hudgins** and **James Murray**. Hudgins returns to the starting lineup at left tackle, where he started the final 10 games in 2014. Murray started last season's final seven games at right guard, and will look to make the move to center this spring.

Junior **Rob Kosharek** started six games a year ago, and will look to be a starter at either guard or tackle. Junior **Nick Piker** made one start last season, and will attempt to hold down a starting spot at guard. Several others will look to compete for a starting spot or earn key playing time as back-ups during the spring. Those players include senior **Clint Jackman**, senior **Sam Ranieri**, junior **George Griffin**, sophomore **Daniel Bernard**, sophomore **Charlie Steele** and junior transfer **Scott Kingsley**.

2015 SPRING OUTLOOK

DEFENSE

The defensive line looks to be a strength, with every player off last season's final two-deep chart returning. The line will be led by senior **Mike Galantini**, who started all 12 games last season. Galantini led all defensive linemen with 37 tackles a year ago, including three sacks and four tackles for loss. Senior **Richard Barber**, who also started all 12 games in 2014, should be another key factor. Barber totaled 24 tackles last season, with one sack and two tackles for loss. Junior **Dean Doe** also returns up front, after starting eight times last year. Doe recorded 30 tackles in 2014 with three sacks and six tackles for loss.

Senior **Jacob Gonzales** also looks to see significant playing time along the line after totaling 17 tackles last season, while senior **Dewayne Cameron** will attempt to work his way back into the lineup after missing the majority of the 2014 campaign due to injury. Sophomore **Jack Kutschke** and sophomore **Phil Zobrest** both gained valuable experience as backups a year ago, and will look to become bigger factors in the spring.

Others who will attempt to break into the defensive line rotation include sophomore **Bradni Black**, sophomore **Jordan Kupec** and sophomore **Patrick Stewart**.

Senior **John Zakrzewski** returns to one of the starting spots for Holy Cross at inside linebacker. Zakrzewski led the team with 103 total tackles in 2014, in addition to recording three sacks, nine tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and three pass breakups. Sophomore **Nick McBeath** looks to win the other starting job at inside linebacker, after ranking third on the team with 43 total tackles last year. Another key player could be junior Kyle Young, who tallied 14 tackles, two fumble recoveries and an interception last season. Senior **John Turner** and sophomore **Dan Proano** will also be in the competition for key playing time.

At outside linebacker, the returning players are led by senior **J.T. Frank** and senior **Ryan Smith**, who both started four games in 2014. Frank totaled 24 tackles, two pass breakups and four tackles for loss a year ago, while Smith recorded 25 tackles, five sacks, six tackles for loss and three forced fumbles. Senior **Kobe Osei-Boaten** also looks to work his way into the rotation, after missing all but one game in 2014 due to injury. Other who could work their way onto the field include senior **Kenny Acquah** and sophomore **Lawton Ward**.

The secondary has a number of key players returning, led by senior strong safety **Matt Bhaya**. Bhaya recorded 40 tackles and four pass breakups last season, despite missing four games due to injury. Junior Luke Ford should also be back in the lineup, after an injury cost him the final seven games of 2014. Ford totaled 28 tackles, two interceptions and three pass breakups a year ago. Senior **Julian Kaminoff**, sophomore **Chase Stratton** and sophomore **Ahmad Tyler** are others who could earn playing at safety time this spring.

The Crusaders return both of their starting cornerbacks in senior **Steven Martinez** and sophomore **Alim Muhammad**. Martinez led the team with six pass breakups last season, while intercepting two passes and ranking fourth on the squad with 43 total tackles. Muhammad finished the 2014 campaign with 32 tackles and four pass breakups.

Senior **Dabness Atkins** and senior **Coan Calabrese** give Holy Cross two other experienced options at cornerback. Atkins tallied 21 tackles, a pass breakup and two tackles for loss last year, while Calabrese had 16 tackles, an interception and a pass breakup. Junior **Ronald Millhouse**, sophomore **Brett Laurie** and sophomore **Mike McCaffrey** will also push to see action at cornerback.



SPECIAL TEAMS

The Crusaders should be solid in the kicking game, with the return of their top three players for last season. Senior **Connor Fitzgerald** has the versatility to handle all of the kicking roles, and scored a team-high 54 points in 2014 while hitting 11 of 17 field goals and 21 of 21 extra points. Fitzgerald also averaged 41.2 yards on 40 punts, and 53.6 yards on 11 kickoffs.

Junior **Zane Wasp** provides another strong options as a placekicker and on kickoffs. Wasp made three of four field goals and two of five extra points last year, in addition to averaging 59.6 yards on 39 kickoffs. Sophomore **Will McGrail** could be a factor as a punter, after averaging 38.0 yards on nine punts in 2014. In addition, sophomore transfer **A.J. Wells** will join in the competition for all three kicking spots.

In the return game, the Crusaders have a number of experienced players returning. Raymond leads the way after bringing back 13 punts for 121 yards and eight kickoffs for 149 yards a year ago. Flaherty, Muhammad and Wiczorek also have experience on both kickoff and punt returns, while Harton and McCaffrey could be factors on kickoff returns.

At long snapper, Gonzales and Kutschke are the top candidates to win the starting job this spring.

SCHEDULE

The 2015 schedule looks to be challenging, as it includes six Patriot League games and five tough non-conference contests. During the conference portion of the schedule, the Crusaders will face Colgate, Georgetown and Lafayette at home, while traveling to Bucknell, Fordham and Lehigh. In the non-league portion of the slate, Holy Cross will play Albany, Brown and Bryant at Fitton Field, and hit the road to face Monmouth and Towson.

- Recorded four solo tackles against Fordham in 2014, including a quarterback sack and two tackles for loss.
- Totaled five tackles in the 2014 victory over Lehigh, with one quarterback sack.
- Tallied six total tackles with one quarterback sack in the 2012 contest at Lafayette.
- Has now totaled 92 tackles, seven quarterback sacks and 10 tackles for loss during his Holy Cross career.
- Selected to the 2014 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

KALIF RAYMOND (SR., WR/KR)

- Returns as one of Holy Cross' starting wide receivers, in addition to serving as the team's top kickoff and punt returner.
- Ranked third on the team with 39 receptions for 305 yards and two touchdowns during the 2014 campaign.
- Averaged 18.6 yards on eight kickoff returns and 9.3 yards on 13 punt returns last season.
- Ranked fourth on the team with 591 all-purpose yards in 2014.
- Ranked third in the Patriot League in punt returns and eighth in receptions in 2014.
- Has caught 81 passes for 705 yards and five touchdowns in 29 career games played, while averaging 22.3 yards on 66 kickoff returns and 6.2 yards on 41 punt returns.
- Named first team All-Patriot League, All-New England and All-ECAC in 2012, in addition to being selected to the College Sports Journal National All-Freshman Team.

ALIM MUHAMMAD (SO., CB)

- Returning starter for the Crusaders at cornerback.
- Saw action in 10 contests during the 2014 campaign, starting nine times.
- Recorded 32 total tackles in 2014, including 26 solo stops.
- Tied for second on the team with four pass breakups in 2014.
- Returned eight kickoffs for 157 yards and four punts for 71 yards during the 2014 campaign.
- Made a career-high six solo tackles in the 2014 victory at Lafayette, in addition to returning three punts for 64 yards.
- Totaled five tackles and a pass breakup at Dartmouth in 2014.
- Recorded three solo tackles and a pass breakup during the 2014 victory over Morgan State.
- Made two solo tackles and returned five kickoffs for 100 yards in the 2014 contest at Harvard.
- Had two pass breakups and one tackle at Albany in 2014.

JAKE WIECZOREK (JR., WR)

- Returns to the lineup as Holy Cross' top wide receiver.
- Earned second team All-Patriot League honors in 2014.
- Named first team Capital One Academic All-District and Academic All-Patriot League during the 2014 season.
- Led the team with 50 receptions for 694 yards and five scores in 2014, while totaling a team-best 823 all-purpose yards.
- Also returned five punts for 71 yards and four kickoffs for 57 yards during the 2014 season.
- Ranked sixth in the Patriot League in receiving yards and ninth in receptions last year.
- Had a career-high 11 receptions for 98 yards at Harvard in 2014.
- Caught seven passes for a career-best 149 yards and a touchdown in the 2014 contest at Albany.
- In 24 career games played at Holy Cross, has now caught 62 passes for 909 yards and seven touchdowns.

PETER PUJALS (JR., QB)

- Returning starter for the Crusaders at quarterback.
- Named second team All-Patriot League in 2014.
- Started all 12 games during the 2014 campaign.
- Completed 225 of 375 passes for 2,353 yards and 10 touchdowns in 2014, in addition to leading the team in rushing with 705 yards and six scores on 170 carries.
- Finished the 2014 campaign ranked third in the Patriot League in passing yards and total offense, fourth in passing efficiency and sixth in rushing yards.
- Has now played in 22 games over the course of his Holy Cross career with 20 starts, hitting on 436 of 707 passes for 4,614 yards and 29 touchdowns, while rushing the ball 306 times for 1,174 yards and 14 scores.
- Selected as the 2013 Patriot League Rookie of the Year.
- Placed eighth in the voting for the 2013 Jerry Rice Award.

JOHN ZAKRZEWSKI (SR., LB)

- Returning starter for the Crusaders at inside linebacker.
- Started all 12 games during the 2014 campaign.
- Led the team with 103 total tackles in 2014, including 80 solo stops, three quarterback sacks and nine tackles for loss.
- Also recorded three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and an interception in 2014.
- Led the team in tackles six times last season, while reaching double-figures in tackles five times.
- A two-time Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week selection during the 2014 campaign.
- Made a career-high 14 tackles at Georgetown in 2014.
- Totaled 11 tackles with a quarterback sack and three tackles for loss in the 2014 victory over Morgan State.
- Has now totaled 123 tackles, three quarterback sacks and 10 tackles for loss during his Holy Cross career.

HEAD COACH TOM GILMORE



Tom Gilmore is in his 12th season as the head football coach at the College of the Holy Cross in 2015. The Crusaders stand 57-56 overall (34-26 in the Patriot League) during the last 11 seasons under Gilmore's leadership, and are one of the most successful program's in the conference during that time frame. He has also coached three-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and three-time Walter Payton Award finalist Dominic Randolph, and owns a career record of 60-64 during his time at Holy Cross.

The Crusaders finished with an overall mark of 4-8 during the

2014 season, after going 3-9 in 2013 and 2-9 in 2012. Seventeen of Holy Cross' 26 losses during the last two years have come by seven points or less, while the 2012 regular season schedule was ranked as the hardest in the nation according to the NCAA. The Crusaders earned eight spots on the All-Patriot League teams in 2012, while three players were honored in both 2013 and 2014.

During the 2011 season, Gilmore's squad posted an overall record of 6-5 and a 4-2 mark in the Patriot League. The Crusaders led the conference in passing defense (195.2 yards/game), while standing second in total offense (400.9 yards/game), passing offense (268.0 yards/game), pass efficiency (129.4 rating), pass efficiency defense (115.7 rating) and net punting (35.7 yards/punt). Holy Cross placed 12 players on the All-Patriot League team, with five of them earning first team honors.

In 2010, Gilmore led the Crusaders to an overall record of 6-5, including a 4-2 mark against Patriot League foes. As a team, Holy Cross led the league in kickoff returns (24.1 yards/return) and punt returns (15.9 yards/return), while standing third in scoring offense (22.6), passing offense (224.0 yards/game) and net punting (34.3 yards/punt). Eleven different Crusaders earned All-Patriot League honors at the conclusion of the season, including six first team selections.

During the 2009 campaign, Gilmore led Holy Cross to its first Patriot League championship since 1991, with an overall mark of 9-3 and a 5-1 record in conference play. The Crusaders also advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for only the second time in school history, suffering a narrow 38-28 road loss to eventual national champion Villanova in the first round. Gilmore's 2009 team led the Patriot League in scoring offense (32.2 points/game), net punting (35.0 yards/punt) and punt returns (9.5 yards/return), while ranking fourth in the nation in passing offense (314.9 yards/game) and sixth in total offense (433.6 yards/game).

At the conclusion of the 2009 campaign, two of Gilmore's players were named All-Americans, while the Crusaders totaled 15 All-Patriot League selections and four spots on the All-New England team. In addition, he was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year and the New England Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award.

In 2008, Gilmore's Crusaders posted an overall record of 7-4 and finished second in the Patriot League with a 5-1 conference record. Holy Cross led the league in scoring offense (34.4 points/game), passing offense (348.9 yards/game) and total offense (455.4 yards/game), while ranking first in the nation in first downs (25.9 first downs/game). In 2008, Gilmore had 11 players named All-Patriot League and four players selected All-New England.

During the 2007 campaign, Gilmore led Holy Cross to an overall mark of 7-4, while placing second in the Patriot League at 4-2. The Crusaders led the conference in total offense (463.4 yards/game), scoring offense (35.9 points/game), passing offense (335.2 yards/game), turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers/game) and pass efficiency (140.0 rating), while standing second in pass defense (183.8 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (117.0 rating). Seven of Gilmore's players earned All-Conference honors in 2007, with wide receiver Ryan Maher being selected a first team All-American.

In 2006, Gilmore was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year, after his squad posted an overall record of 7-4, while finishing just a game out of first place in the conference at 4-2. The Crusaders nearly tied for the league title, as they suffered a one-point loss at Colgate in the season finale. Holy Cross also led the Patriot League in several statistical categories: total offense (384.4 yards per game), passing offense (271.5 yards per game), pass efficiency defense (108.4 rating), first downs (239) and third down conversions (46.3 percent). In addition, seven of Gilmore's players earned All-League honors.

During the 2005 campaign, Gilmore led the Crusaders to an overall record of 6-5 and a fourth place finish in the Patriot League with a 3-3 mark in conference games. In addition, Gilmore's team posted a 13-10 road victory over 10th-ranked Lehigh, good for the school's first win against a ranked opponent since the 2000 season. Following the conclusion of the 2005 campaign, seven Crusaders earned All-Patriot League honors, with tailback / kick returner Steve Silva being named a consensus first team All-American, and earning National Special Teams Player of the Year honors from Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette. Gilmore's 2005 team also led the Patriot League in turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers per game), kickoff returns (23.4 yards per return), punt returns (16.0 yards per return) and red zone efficiency (scoring 90.5 percent of the time).

In 2004, Gilmore's first Holy Cross squad finished with an overall record of 3-8, rebounding from an 0-5 start to finish 3-3 in their final six games. The Crusaders tripled the team's win total from the year prior to his arrival, and finished among the Patriot League leaders in both kickoff returns (first, 23.7 yards per return) and passing offense (second, 207.3 yards per game).

Gilmore was introduced as the 27th head football coach in Holy Cross history on January 8, 2004, after serving as an assistant coach at Lehigh, Dartmouth, Pennsylvania and Columbia for the previous 18 seasons. An Academic All-American at Penn, he graduated in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in computer mathematics. Born Sept. 25, 1964, Gilmore and his wife, Joan, reside in Shrewsbury, Mass., with their two children, Sarah and John.

2014 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game #1 • Albany 14, Holy Cross 13 August 30, 2014 • Albany, N.Y.

Neil Morrison recovered a fumble and returned it 79 yards for a touchdown with 44 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, as Albany came from behind to defeat Holy Cross 14-13 at Bob Ford Field. Holy Cross totaled 440 yards of total offense on the evening, while holding Albany to just 263 total yards from scrimmage. Peter Pujals led the way by completing 23 of 42 passes for 323 yards and a touchdown, while Jake Wieczorek had a career-high seven receptions for 149 yards and a score. The Crusaders opened the scoring at the 2:06-mark of the first quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Connor Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald added a 23-yard field goal early in the second quarter, then Pujals threw a one-yard touchdown pass to Wieczorek with just eight seconds left before halftime to make the score 13-0 at the break. After neither team scored any points in the third quarter, Albany's Will Fiacchi threw a 12-yard scoring strike to Brian Parker to make the score 13-7 with 11:05 left to play. Holy Cross was later able to drive down to Albany's 21-yard line with less than two minutes to play, before Morrison's fumble return gave the Great Danes their first lead of the game. The Crusaders were unable to cross midfield on their final possession, as Albany escaped with the victory. Luke Ford led the Holy Cross defense with 11 tackles and two pass breakups, while John Zakrzewski added nine tackles.

Game #2 • Holy Cross 29, Morgan State 26 September 6, 2014 • Worcester, Mass.

Shane Taylor scored the game-winning touchdown on a one-yard run as time expired, to lift Holy Cross to a 29-26 victory over Morgan State at Fitton Field. The Bears had taken a 26-23 lead with 3:39 remaining in the fourth quarter on a two-yard touchdown run by Herb Walker. The Crusaders then drove across midfield, and on third-and 16 from the Morgan State 25 yard line with less than 30 seconds remaining, Peter Pujals threw a 22-yard pass to Jake Wieczorek to give Holy Cross first-and-goal at the three-yard line. After spiking the ball to stop the clock and a two-yard rush by Pujals, the Crusaders called their final timeout facing third-and-goal from the one-yard line. Holy Cross initially sent out its field goal unit to attempt to force overtime, but reversed course after a Morgan State timeout, allowing Taylor to score the winning touchdown. The game went back and forth throughout the first two quarters, before the Crusaders took a 16-13 lead into the locker room at halftime. Following a scoreless third quarter, the Bears pulled ahead 19-16 on a 46-yard scoring run by Walker. Holy Cross reclaimed the lead when Pujals hit Kalif Raymond for a seven-yard touchdown with 10:17 to play, making the score 23-19. Taylor finished the game with 78 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries, in his first career start at tailback. Pujals completed 16 of 29 passes for 193 yards and a score, while rushing 15 times for 74 yards and another touchdown. Wieczorek led all receivers with five catches for 112 yards. Defensively, the Crusaders were led by John Zakrzewski with 11 tackles, a sack and three tackles for loss. Morgan State was led by Walker, who rushed 29 times for a school-record 271 yards and two touchdowns.

Game #10 • Holy Cross 27, Lehigh 20 November 8, 2014 • Worcester, Mass.

Peter Pujals accounted for 245 yards of total offense and two touchdowns, as Holy Cross posted a 27-20 victory over Lehigh at Fitton Field. Pujals completed 14 of 23 passes for 175 yards and a touchdown, while rushing 12 times for 70 yards and another score. The Mountain Hawks opened the scoring at the 7:55-mark of the first quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Ryan Pandy. The Crusaders tied the game at 3-3 in the second quarter with a 28-yard field goal from Connor Fitzgerald, and claimed the lead with just 1:01 left before halftime on an 11-yard touchdown run by Pujals. John Zakrzewski then intercepted a pass on Lehigh's next possession, and Pujals hit Jake Wieczorek with a 27-yard scoring strike to put Holy Cross up 17-3 heading into the locker room. Nick Shafnisky found Troy Pelletier for a 58-yard touchdown pass on the Mountain Hawks' opening drive of the third quarter, but the Crusaders came right back with a three-yard scoring run by Gabe Guild to lead 24-10. Pandy then connected on a 38-yard field goal, before Fitzgerald hit a 34-yard field goal to put Holy Cross up 27-13 heading to the fourth quarter. An 11-yard touchdown run by Brandon Yosha made the score 27-20 with 3:44 left to play, and Lehigh would get one last possession with less than two minutes remaining. But an interception by Steven Martinez with 1:17 to go sealed the win for the Crusaders. Tyler Artim finished the game with four receptions for 80 yards, while Guild rushed 15 times for 41 yards. Zakrzewski led the Holy Cross defense with 11 tackles, two tackles for loss, an interception and a pass breakup. Lehigh was led by Pelletier, who had 10 receptions for a career-high 214 yards.

Game #11 • Bucknell 31, Holy Cross 24 (OT) November 15, 2014 • Worcester, Mass.

Bucknell's Matt DelMauro rushed 30 times for 139 yards and three touchdowns, to lead the Bison to a 31-24 overtime victory over Holy Cross at Fitton Field. Following the contest, DelMauro received the Dr. Edward N. Anderson Award as the game's most valuable player. The Crusaders opened the scoring at the 6:42-mark of the first quarter on a four-yard touchdown run by Peter Pujals. Bucknell tied the game early in the second quarter on a one-yard scoring run by DelMauro, then claimed on a 10-7 halftime lead on a 25-yard Derek Maurer field goal. Holy Cross pulled back in front in the third quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by Pujals, before Trey Lauletta ran five yards for a score on the opening play of the fourth quarter to put the Bison up 17-14. Pujals would then score his third touchdown of the day on a six-yard run, before a seven-yard scoring run by DelMauro gave Bucknell a 24-21 lead with 5:39 left to play. With just four seconds remaining in regulation, Connor Fitzgerald kicked a 32-yard field goal to tie the game at 24-24 and force overtime. After DelMauro scored on a three-yard run to give the Bison a 31-24 lead, Holy Cross was unable to score on its overtime possession and Bucknell claimed the victory. Pujals finished the day with 44 rushing yards and three scores on 20 carries, while completing 23 of 38 passes for 201 yards. Ryan Smith led the Crusader defense with four tackles, two forced fumbles, a quarterback sack and a fumble recovery.
